II. Questions and Review-Chapter 2

1. The Apostle John refers to Peter as Simon Peter, why did John use both names ? (page 36).
2. What are Peter's character qualities described on pages 47-48?
3. Peter was the only disciple Jesus addressed as Satan, why ?
4. Peter's raw personality consisted of the following: His inquisitiveness, His initiative, and His involvement. How could Jesus shape these personality traits for ministry ?
5. In what setting would you be viewed as a leader ? When are you most like Peter ?
6. Peter believed that there were still some "Simon"-like qualities in his life, he was also confident that he was the "Rock" Jesus credited him as being. What is a strength in your spiritual life ?
7. Jesus reminded Peter of his potential as a rock-solid leader. By use of his name, Jesus wanted to challenge Peter's tendencies to be unreliable and shift.
